## Dove Cottage

Discover the place where radical poetry was written, read and shared. Read from *Lyrical Ballads* in the Front Kitchen and find 'Composed upon Westminster Bridge' upstairs. Try on Regency-inspired bonnets and accessories and immerse yourself in the world of the Wordsworths.

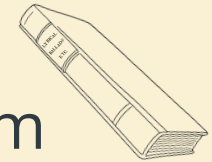


## Woodland Walk

Follow the Woodland path uphill and experience the landscape as Dorothy Wordsworth did 200 years ago. Dorothy was one of the Lake District's early women mountaineers and climbed Scafell Pike, England's highest mountain, in 1818. Take a moment to rest at the top and enjoy spectacular views across the Vale of Grasmere.



## Museum



Discover how Wordsworth pressed the 're-set button on English poetry' and how his perspective on life is still inspiring 250 years after his birth. See the first edition of *Lyrical Ballads* in its original board covers, as Mary would have known it, alongside first editions of *Poems in Two Volumes*, *Guide to the Lakes*, and Dorothy Wordsworth's Grasmere journal. Plus have a go at writing with quill and ink.

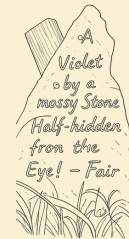


## Garden-Orchard
